

LENT

Lenten Discipleship Challenge**Week Two March 1-7**

Parishioners from throughout our Bread of Life/ Pan de Vida Family offer insights for week two. One theme of our prescribed readings is holy encounters. The stage is set for divine intimacy, as Lent week two always begins with the Transfiguration. The blueprint towards glorious intimacy with our God is spelled out in Isaiah (1:17-18): “Search for justice, help the oppressed, hear the orphan’s plea, defend the widow,” to do so is to share in God’s very life — “the greatest among you will be the one who serves the rest” (Matthew 23:11). Most of all we are invited to intimacy with Christ in his redemptive suffering. It does us well to remember that our God, in Christ, has intimately experienced the whole range of human emotions. With such Gospel truth, we continue towards the ultimate encounter of every Lent: onward to the cross and to the empty tomb.

Second Sunday of Lent, March 1

Genesis 12:1-4a; 2 Timothy 1:8b-10; Matthew 17:1-9

In the passage about the Transfiguration, Jesus led the disciples to the top of the mountain. They had an astounding encounter with the holy and the disciples wanted to remain there. But Jesus then led them back down to the very things they had left behind. Spend a few minutes in prayer on the top of the mountain. Get a good mountain-top perspective of your life. Look at life from a distance. Where is God in all of this? Like the disciples, our life too is lived below. But it is at the top of the mountain that we must get our perspective.

Monday, March 2

Daniel 9:4b-10; Luke 6:36-38

When we encounter true holiness, we become immediately aware of our own shortcomings. This is evident in Daniel’s response in the first reading (9:4b-10), where he humbly acknowledges not only his personal sin but the collective rebellion of his people against God. In doing so, Daniel opens himself to a profound experience of God’s mercy and compassion. In today’s Gospel, Jesus calls us to extend that same mercy to others. Is there someone you have struggled to forgive? Keeping in mind your own need for God’s forgiveness, take one intentional step toward reconciliation—through prayer, a kind gesture, or a sincere conversation that allows healing to begin.

Tuesday, March 3

Isaiah 1:10, 16-20; Matthew 23:1-12

The prophet Isaiah encourages us to honestly look at how we are living. Do our daily actions align with God? Is there a mismatch between our Christian beliefs and our everyday living? If so, Isaiah tells us they can be unlearned. Instead “Learn to do good, make justice your aim; redress the wronged, hear the orphan’s plea, defend the widow” (Isaiah 1:17). “Come now, let us set things right, says the LORD” (Isaiah 1:18). Each of us has a “reset button” within us. Take a few minutes to reflect on the past few days. Ask for the strength and humility to identify one behavior you want to unlearn. Perhaps one related to pride (the root of all sin). As in Matthew 23:12, “Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted.”

Wednesday, March 4

Jeremiah 18:18-20; Matthew 20:17-28

Holy encounters in today’s scripture centers on service. These texts contrast human ambition with following Jesus. The prophet Jeremiah experiences persecution for his faithfulness, highlighting a “holy encounter” where he is rejected, yet continues to stand in the gap for the people, offering prayer

instead of retaliation. Jesus redefines greatness during a “holy encounter” with his disciples, specifically James and John (through their mother), who seek positions of power. Jesus stated that true greatness comes from becoming a servant, offering his life as a ransom. These scriptures invite us to embrace the humility of Christ, turning away from worldly desires, to find true purpose in servanthood. Will you accept the invitation? What might that look like today?

Thursday, March 5

Jeremiah 17:5-10; Luke 16:19-31

Throughout our day we interact with many different people. Oftentimes, these interchanges are quick with little attention given to the person or persons we encounter. Today’s gospel describes a situation where a rich man does not give attention or action in his daily crossings with Lazarus- a poor man lying at his threshold. Jesus reminds us that how we treat others is how we treat him. Today, be mindful of encounters with others- family, friends or strangers. If you find someone in need, do not miss the opportunity to provide support even if this action is simply offering a listening ear or a word of encouragement. They may have more impact than you know.

Friday, March 6

Genesis 37:3-4, 12-13a, 17b-28a; Matthew 21:33-43, 45-46

In Genesis, Jacob’s sons are filled with rage and jealousy as Joseph is favored by their father (Genesis 37:3). This leads to betrayal, as the brothers ultimately sell Joseph to passing traders. In Matthew, Jesus tells a parable to some Jewish religious leaders about tenants who abuse and kill a landowner’s servants and his son (Matthew 21:35-38). Jesus warns them that they are behaving like the wicked tenants, and because of this, their authority will be given to others who choose to bear fruit. While the consequences may not always seem as severe as those in today’s readings, there are still implications when we reject God trying to speak to us. Today, identify something you have been avoiding or rejecting, and consider what message you may be missing.

Saturday, March 7, Sts. Perpetua & Felicity

Micah 7:14-15, 18-20; Luke 15:1-13, 11-32

Who is truly lost—the brother who returns home to his father because it is the last place he felt loved, or the brother who believes his father is being unfair? How often do we fixate on fairness rather than love? What is the difference between fairness and justice? We are called to be like the father, to do what is just: to welcome home the one who longs to return, regardless of whether it feels fair or not. Reach out to those who are unwanted and love them where they are, however that might look.

St. Helen

Lent calls us to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving—spiritual road signs guiding us through this holy season. While our liturgies anchor our prayer, St. Helen Parish also chooses an annual Lenten project to turn our fasting into tangible love for our neighbors.

This year, we are responding to a pressing need within our own community, highlighted by Archbishop Casey's recent letter to the faithful regarding our immigrant brothers and sisters. As the Archbishop reminds us, "The life of Jesus challenges us to consider how we treat those who are refugees, those who are seeking a home, and those who are unjustly deemed criminals."

This mission hits close to home: 33% of our St. Helen School family are members of the immigrant and refugee community. Many are our brothers and sisters through baptism, yet they face daunting social and economic hurdles.

Our Lenten Almsgiving Project will provide:

- Essential Utilities: Assistance with electricity and water payments.
- Housing Stability: Rent assistance to ensure families remain in their homes.

While our dedicated St. Vincent de Paul Society continues its vital work for the broader community, funds raised through this Lenten project will go directly to our school community. Our Family Advocate from the school will identify specific families in need and we will offer a one-time annual payment sponsorship.

We invite you to stand in solidarity with our school family this Lent. Your sacrifice ensures that our fasting does not merely aid our own spirituality but flows out in active love for those closest to us.

**Immaculate Conception**

Lent is an opportunity to hear God's call for true conversion and love of our neighbor.

Archbishop Casey's February 1, 2026 letter acknowledges the increasingly divisive and unsettling times facing our country and world, especially for those on the margins—particularly migrants, immigrants, and refugees who find themselves challenged and facing an uncertain future. He urges us to reflect on who we are as people of faith and to serve as a counterpoint to the world's division.

Many of our migrant, immigrant, and refugee brothers and sisters live with fear and uncertainty about separation, employment, healthcare, and meeting basic needs. Rooted in the Gospel call to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, care for the sick, and visit the imprisoned (cf. Mt. 25:35-36), the 2026 Lenten Almsgiving project will provide emergency assistance to migrant, immigrant, and refugee families struggling to afford essentials such as groceries, utilities, and housing. Funds will be distributed after careful assessment, with each family eligible for assistance once within a twelve-month period to help as many people as possible.

You may contribute to the Almsgiving Project in multiple ways:

- by check, (made out to the parish) mailed to the parish offices, or placed in the collection basket either in an almsgiving envelope or with "almsgiving" written on the memo line.
- by cash, in the collection basket inside an almsgiving envelope or another envelope with "almsgiving" clearly labeled on it
